- Established a cross district investigative team, the Tactical Intelligence Gathering and Enforcement Response (TIGER) team, to identify patterns across districts and target known armed robbery offenders

- Enhanced crime analysis capacity and implemented the Management Analytics for eXcellence (MAX) model
